

1 Peter 1:1-2

¹ Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ,

To those who reside as aliens, scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, who are chosen ² according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, by the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to obey Jesus Christ and be sprinkled with His blood: May grace and peace be yours in the fullest measure.

1. Peter describes what a Christian looks like:
 - a. A Christian is an alien. (v.1)
 - i. Christians are in the world but not of the World.
 1. **John 17:15-17**
 - ii. While we live in the World we should not conform to the World.
 1. **Romans 12:1-2**
 - b. A Christian is chosen by God. (v.1-2)
 - i. A Christian is born by the will of God.
 1. **John 1:12-13**
 - ii. God has given the saved to Christ.
 1. **John 17:6**
 - iii. Christians were chosen by the foreknowledge of God.
 1. **Romans 8:28-30**
 - c. A Christian is chosen by the process of Sanctification. (v.2)
 - i. Doctrine of Sanctification:
 1. Sanctification is both being set apart by God (Positional) and an ever increasing reliance and faith on him (Practical)
 - a. Positional
 - i. When a person gets saved, God changes his Position in relation to God.
 - ii. **Jude 1:1**
 1. The word “kept” in the Greek is “hagiazō” which means sanctified.
 - b. Practical
 - i. Practical Sanctification involves God’s Spirit and our Will.
 1. **Hebrews 12:14**
 2. **Romans 8:12-14**
 2. You can’t live Practical Sanctification if you haven’t received Positional Sanctification.

- d. God chooses Christians for two purposes:
 - i. To obey Jesus Christ. (v.2)
 - 1. The obedience of Christ is the same as the love of Christ.
 - a. John 14:15**
 - ii. To be sprinkled by Christ's blood. (v.2)
 - 1. John 1:14-18**
 - e. A Christian may have grace and peace in full measure. (v.2)
 - i. We have access to God's grace.
 - 1. Hebrews 4:14-16**
 - ii. We have access to God's peace.
 - 1. Luke 2:14**
 - 2. John 14:27**
 - 3. Philippians 4:4-7**
2. Conclusions:
- a. A Christian is a person regenerated by the plan and grace of God.
 - b. A Christian lives in the world but is not conformed to the world.
 - c. A Christian has been set apart by God and will in obedience apply their will to the everyday process of Sanctification.
 - d. The regenerative power of God in our hearts has opened up the vast riches of His grace and peace for us.

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
